Directions: The following table includes 9 different assignments with varying point values that you can choose from to complete. **The total Travel Package project is worth a maximum of 70 points.** How you choose to accomplish or work towards that 70 points is up to you. Meaning, you can do any combination of the assignments with the exception that each type of assignment can only be done once. There is no limit to how many of the assignments you choose to do. For example, if you choose to do every single assignment listed, and you manage to earn full credit for each assignment, the maximum number of points you can earn for the entire Travel Package project will be 70 points. *Please check off which assignments you have selected to do, and then staple this handout on top of all of your work.*

<p>Choose a painting in one of the museums you visit. Sit in front of the painting and write a “stream of consciousness” piece describing the painting and what you are thinking/experiencing. (1/2-1 page)</p> <p>Museums to visit: Norton Simon, MOCA, LACMA, The Getty, Getty Villa. You (and friends if they're willing to help) perform a song (your brainworm???) and/or dance on the side of the street (at the beach?). Did any of the onlookers throw you change? <p>Choose any writer we have read in this class. Find another essay written by him/her and write a 1-2 page paper analyzing the author's style and purpose.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/></p> <p style="text-align: right;">15 points</p>	<p>Read a book written by Barbara Kingsolver.</p> <p>Write a book review. 2-4 pages AND an interview with Ms. P when you return.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/></p> <p style="text-align: right;">30 points</p>	<p>Food critic! You have been hired by the <i>L.A. Times</i> to write a review (1 page) of a restaurant you visit (no chain restaurants). <p>Go to the College Board website. Click on “AP.” Click on “courses and exams.” Click on “English Language.” Read the description provided on the page. Then click on “reading skills” and read the page. Next, click on “writing skills” and read the page. Choose a current event or controversial topic. Interview several strangers (but be safe! make sure you don't do this alone!) about the event/topic.</p> <p>Record your interviews (preferred) or take pictures with the interviewees.
