Directions: The following table includes 9 different assignments with varying point values that you can choose from to complete. **The total Love Package project is worth a maximum of 40 points.** How you choose to accomplish or work towards that 40 points is up to you. Meaning, you can do any combination of the assignments with the exception that each type of assignment can only be done once. There is no limit to how many of the assignments you choose to do. For example, if you choose to do every single assignment listed, and you manage to earn full credit for each assignment, the maximum number of points you can earn for the entire Love Package project will be 40 points. *Please check off which assignments you have selected to do, and then staple this handout on top of all of your work. Write a review of the movie. (1-2 pages)</p> <p><i><u>I just watched Slumdog Millionaire.</u> Highly recommend it!</i></p> <p>Include your ticket stub to this assignment.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> 10 points</p>	<p>Visit the Broad Contemporary Art Museum at LACMA. Write a 1-2 page description of your experience. Mention specific works and your reactions to them.</p> <p>Attach a ticket stub and a picture of you in front of the museum. <p>Annie Dillard. Find and read an essay written by Annie Dillard. Annotate your copy and write 4 double-entry (dialectical) journals.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> 30 points</p>	<p>Get together with another colleague(s) and celebrate the new year by recording a live performance of a holiday song.</p> <p>Turn in a cd or cassette tape. 1 per group is fine.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> 10 points</p>	<p>Read the latest issue of the New Yorker. Write a rhetorical analysis essay on one of the feature articles.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> 40 points</p>
<p>Go out of your way to do something kind for someone (i.e. parents, siblings, homeless) during these holidays.
